

“All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. I. Three Disciple-Making Process Elements: Go, Baptize, Teach

Jesus employed the same strategy to invest in the twelve that He calls on us to use here in Memphis and beyond!

II. A Closer Look at the Go Phase: Seek, See, Share, Serve, Speak

- A. Seek: Make intentional contact with “outsiders.”
- B. See: Look past history to discern points of pain and a yearning for grace.
- C. Share: Fellowship with those who need care.
- D. Serve: Use practical (and selfless) service to make what you say credible.
- E. Speak: Use words to explain how the Gospel can take them to a new and better place.
