Join Your Friends in Service to Our City by Diane Brower, Memphis Ministries Team

The overall crime rate in Memphis is 312.48% above the national average, according to the most recent data from the FBI. The child poverty rate is 32.7% (a decrease from two years prior), according to the University of Memphis. The TN Commission on Children and Youth stated that in the last year, 53% of high school girls and 30% of high school boys reported feeling sad or hopeless daily for two or more weeks, a 63% increase since 2011. Creation is indeed groaning, eagerly waiting for redemption.

Memphis needs Jesus. Not only Jesus the Savior; but Jesus the Creator, Sustainer, and Reconciler of all things. He gives the God-glorifying and lifefulfilling new self. His plan is to work through Christians who see the image of God in every individual and commit to spending sustained time praying, caring, and sharing the gospel with their neighbors in the greater-Memphis area. There are amazing ministries doing this work daily in our city. As First Evan's Memphis Ministries Team, our job is to help of our church come alongside them.

Our team's vision is for First Evaners to develop relationships, love our neighbors, and share the gospel throughout the city. It is important that we minister in a wholistic manner, meeting physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. Here is just a glimpse of how our people are stepping in with our partners: Some take lunch to those who are gaining skills to become employed and financially stable. Others are loving a pre-K class in Binghampton through prayer and class parties. Some stand on a sidewalk to reach out to those in crisis pregnancies. Some meet with kids for weekly Bible Clubs. Others welcome international students in their homes. Some build tables for refugee families on Wednesdays at church. God is at work in our city through our people and our partners.

We also serve our city through your financial giving. A budget is allocated

to the Memphis Ministries Team through the Missions Fund. We are responsible for understanding our partners to appropriately support pressing needs and upcoming projects. For example, we recently heard from a woman who found healing and redemption in Christ from Life Choices' retreat for women who have abortions in their past. We were able to fully fund their next retreat!

You can start taking action. You can reach out to Steven Yeo at syeo@firstevan.org to discover volunteer opportunities. Check with your Sunday School to see if your class is championing a ministry and serve together as a class. Participate in Meet Memphis, our annual day of serving our ministries, on April 13 (more details coming soon).

Your generosity and service contribute to how narratives and statistics can change in our city. Until we see His kingdom come, let us pray, care, and share to see God glorified in all of Memphis.



For the month of February, the Global Missions Team (GMT) has had the privilege of helping to plan activities for the Student Ministry. The hope of the GMT has been to engage them in the strong missions emphasis of our church. We did that through interviews with some of our Missionaries and National Partners on Sunday mornings and various interactive activities on Wednesday evenings.

One Wednesday, Joel Scoggins had the students take a simple personality test and then he discussed the strengths and weaknesses of each personality when it comes to sharing the gospel. On another evening David Frazier gave the students all candles in a dark room and led them in a demonstration of the gospel spreading (or not spreading!) to the less-reached and unreached areas of the world. They also looked at the opportunities we have right here in the US to profess Christ because of immigration. There was also a chance to interact more extensively with the Bute Family visiting here from Ukraine, and hearing more from their peers about the Common Ground Summer Missions Trip to Romania.
